(Tursiops truncatus)

TDP members conduct relative abundance  
surveys and seek to identify estuarine  
dolphins through their often distinctive  
dorsal fins. By means of identifying individual  
dolphins, TDP and other cooperating  
government agencies and research  
organizations collaborate to study resident  
and transient populations. The dolphins that  
we study are wild and in their natural  
habitat. They are free to roam at will with no  
prediction as to where we will  
spot them next.

Neither The Dolphin Project, nor any  
individual, owns or retains physical possession  
of any dolphin pictured on this brochure.  
Sightings and photographs of all dolphins by  
The Dolphin Project are opportunistic events  
that have occurred during the course of  
organized abundance and photo surveys  
under a General Authorization Permit from  
the National Marine Fisheries Service.  
Individuals who "adopt" a dolphin have no  
rights whatsoever concerning that individual  
or any other wild dolphin.
